FamilySearch continues to gather records worldwide. Understanding the strategies and limitations of gathering these records will help you plan your research and help fill in the gaps in records you seek.

Katelyn "Katie" Ziegler The State Historical Society of Missouri has been digitizing select Missouri newspapers since 2008. Newspaper librarian Katie Ziegler will discuss how to access and make the most of this free database, which currently consists of more than 11.6 million pages.

52G Using Irish Internet Resources

The internet has created an explosion in Irish genealogical research. This talk introduces the host of established internet sites and some of the newest ones for conducting Irish research.

52H *Hidden Treasures on the St. Louis Genealogical Society Website* Jim Ross With more than 1,600 pages, about seven million searchable names, one-of-a-kind interactive

maps, and many additional resources, the StLGS website is a must-visit for those researching St. Louis ancestors. Take a tour of the site with one of the webmasters to see the highlights.
