


StLGS Website—St. Louis Records

The St. Louis Genealogical Society website <www.stlgs.org> contains hundreds of pages with the names of people associated with the St. Louis area. These data pages can all be found within the *Research* section on the *Navigation Bar* of the home page. In many cases, additional resources can be found within the *Research* section, and the user is encouraged to explore that section fully.

On the *Resources* tab in the *Navigation Bar*, the first entry is a list of these data pages. When you click on *St. Louis Records*, you will get a page filled with clickable links that lists what is available on those data pages. Be sure you check back often, as the list is always changing and expanding.
